

First Reading: ACTS OF THE APOSTLES
10:34A, 37-43

Peter preaches about Jesus' life, death, and resurrection.

## Second Reading: <u>COLOSSIANS 3:1-4 OR 1</u> CORINTHIANS 5:6B-8

Colossians: Having been raised by Christ, be concerned with what is above.

1 Corinthians: Let us celebrate this feast with new yeast.

## Gospel: <u>JOHN 20:1-9</u>

Mary of Magdala finds that the stone has been removed from Jesus' tomb.

## **FAMILY CONNECTION:**

In the Easter Gospel we hear about how the disciples found the tomb empty three days after Jesus' death. We are also told that they do not yet understand the Scriptures or that Jesus had been raised from the dead. That understanding gradually unfolded for the disciples as they began to experience the risen Lord. Similarly, our understanding of Jesus' Resurrection unfolds for us throughout our lives.

Gather your family members and ask them to share what they know about the events that happened in the days after Jesus' crucifixion. Invite your family to imagine that they are among Jesus' first disciples. Reflect together on the Gospel with questions such as these: If you had been among the first disciples who heard that the stone had been removed from Jesus' tomb and that Jesus' body was no longer there, what would you think? Recall that this experience is the first indication Jesus' disciples have that He is risen. Throughout the Easter season, we will learn more about how the disciples came to believe that Jesus had been raised from the dead.

"This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad."

## **PARISH HISTORY**

The Decree of Erection of the Parish of St. Bartholomew, Scarborough was issued by His Grace Philip F. Pocock then Coadjutor Archbishop of Toronto on the 31<sup>st</sup> day of May 1968. The spiritual Holy Spirit Parish led to the establishment of a new parish. The new boundaries of the parish are defined as:

North: Steeles Avenue East (South Side)

**South:** MacDonald Cartier Freeway, from Kennedy Rd. To Staines Rd; North on Staines Rd.to Sheppard Ave; East on Sheppard Ave. and an extension thereof to the Pickering Township Line

**East:** Pickering Township Line (West side)

**West:** Kennedy Rd (East side)

It is understood in defining this boundary, unless stated otherwise, both sides of all streets named are to be considered the territory of the new parish of St. Bartholomew. **Father Cryer** was directed to take up his duties as the new pastor not later than **June 27**, **1968**.

Accordingly, three days later, on Sunday, the first Mass in St. Bartholomew's Parish was celebrated in Agincourt Collegiate auditorium for the 200-300 families. In the following year on Sunday **November 23, 1969** Mass was celebrated in the new St. Bartholomew's School and was used for weekly celebration of Mass. We used the school gym for 5 ½ years.

Soon after the parish was formed a Steering Committee was appointed. This committee's work led to election, in 1969, of St. Bartholomew's Parish Council. This council established the following committees: Financial & Building, Liturgical, Community Life.

In February 1972 the Building Committee began interviewing architects, and a few years later on **March 16, 1972** chose Mr. Joseph Bogdan to design & supervise construction of our parish church.

Mr. Bogdans plans were approved and a contract signed with him, **dated December 20, 1972**. The Fairwin Construction Company was awarded the contract in May 1973 and after a sod turning ceremony, construction began on our new church.

It was in December 20, 1973 (Thursday) that the Most Reverend Francis Pocock, D.D., J.C.D. (Archbishop of Toronto) gave the solemn blessing and Mass in the parish.

This year 2023 with hearts filled with joy, we rejoice for the 50 years of the Consecration of our parish.

In addition we have raised <u>\$265</u> from the Palm Crosses. The proceeds will go towards our Building Fund. Fr.Fernan Serrano






Plans/Projects/Activities for our Jubilee Celebration are underway:


