
28th SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME



- 1. This Mass is requested by **immediate family members** only.
- 2. It is intended for loved ones who passed away from

November 8, 2024 to November 6, 2025

- 3. The funeral service must have been held at St. Bartholomew Parish or presided by Fr. Serrano.
- 4. One candle will be provided for each family. Additional candles may be requested with a donation of \$10 each.
- 5. Please submit the following on or before **Friday, October 24, 2025:**
- o Name of the deceased
- o Date of death
- o Your relationship to the deceased
- 6. Submissions by email are preferred (please use the subject line: Memorial Mass). You may also call the parish office and leave a message.
- 7. Forms are also available in the parish office.

SAFETY GRILL APPEAL


Launched June 21 & 22, 2025

Guide to Funeral Arrangements

- 1. **Begin with the funeral home** of your choice. Please do not contact the church directly to set a date or time.
- Share your wishes with the funeral director including preferred date, time, music, and other details.
- 3. The funeral director will contact the parish to coordinate and confirm the arrangements.
- 4. Once everything is confirmed, the **family will meet with the pastor** to select the Readings and finalize details.
- Please call the parish office to schedule an appointment for this meeting, usually after your visit to the funeral home.

Important Notes

- Arrangements must be made by immediate family members only.
- The prayer service (vigil) is led by the priest or deacon on the day before the funeral, normally at 6:00 p.m.
- 3. If you wish to invite another priest to preside, please inform the parish office in advance. The family is responsible for the visiting priest's stipend in addition to the parish offering.
- Eulogies should be given at the funeral home during visitation to avoid delays in proceeding to the cemetery, which may result in additional charges.
- For live streaming, please speak directly with the funeral director, as the parish does not provide this service.
